MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CENTRAL DELTA WATER AGENCY

December 13, 2022

A teleconference meeting of the Board of Directors of the Central Delta Water Agency was convened at 9:30 a.m. at the office of the Agency, 235 East Weber Avenue, Stockton, California.

Participating in the meeting were Directors Rudy Mussi, George Biagi Jr, and Eddie Zuckerman. Others participating were Dante John Nomellini Sr., Chris Neudeck, Dante John Nomellini Jr., George Hartmann, Brett Baker, Lindsay Kammeier, Lisa Crowley, Bruce Blodgett, Dave Forkel, Dominick Gulli, Tom Robinson, Craig Watanabe and Mel Lytle.

The first item of business were the Minutes of the November 8, 2022 meeting. After review,

Second - Director Rudy Mussi, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED that the Minutes of the November 8, 2022, meeting be and they are hereby approved as submitted.

Next Lindsay Kammeier reported that Michael George was meeting with the Board on the issue of whether the environmental group that owns the Dos Rios habitat area along the San Joaquin River could transfer their riparian right rather than fallow their land.

Next, the Financial Report was given, the written portions of which are attached hereto. Along with the Financial Report, the current bills of the Agency were submitted to the Board for their review.

Second - Director George Biagi Jr, the Board unanimously adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the bills of the Agency be and they are hereby approved for payment as submitted.

On legislation nothing new was reported.

As previously reported water use reports for the water year October 2021 through September 2022 reports are due February 1, 2023 and it is expected that the CDWA and SDWA

Delta ACP based on OpenET will be operational but an extension of time for reporting will be needed. License reports will be due February 1, 2023 and reported as in the past.

Enhanced reporting for large diversions is continuing at twice a month.

On Tunnel related Temporary Entry Permits it was reported that DWR was proceeding with additional entries. The challenge to the related EIR was in part granted by the Court and will be submitted to the Judge on the TEP cases for modification of the TEP orders.

The Delta Stewardship Council is continuing to proceed with a proposed regulation relating to the Delta Levee Investment Strategy which is inconsistent with the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Delta, ignores the Delta levees as a system and overlooks many of the interrelated flood impacts and risks.

The draft EIR on the DWR tunnel project called the Delta Conveyance Project (DCP) is out for comments. Comments are being prepared for submittal on December 16th.

On levee programs it was reported that DWR has released a draft Solicitation Package for comment.

The Delta Protection Commission is working on the Natural Heritage Area.

Applications for the DRIP program closed on October 18th.

Thereafter, there being no further business to come before the meeting the meeting was adjourned.
