MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CENTRAL DELTA WATER AGENCY

January 10, 2023

A teleconference meeting of the Board of Directors of the Central Delta Water Agency was convened at 9:30 a.m. at the office of the Agency, 235 East Weber Avenue, Stockton, California.

Participating in the meeting were Directors Rudy Mussi, George Biagi Jr, and Eddie Zuckerman. Others participating were Dante John Nomellini Sr., Dante John Nomellini Jr., George Hartmann, Brett Baker, Lindsay Kammeier, Lisa Crowley, Bruce Blodgett, Dave Forkel, Tom Robinson, Eric Gantenbein, Chris Neudeck, Tim Gobbler, Craig Watanabe and Tom Zuckerman.

The first item of business were the Minutes of the December 13, 2022 meeting. After review,

Next, the Financial Report was given, the written portions of which are attached hereto. Along with the Financial Report, the current bills of the Agency were submitted to the Board for their review.

Second - Director George Biagi Jr, the Board unanimously adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the bills of the Agency be and they are hereby approved for payment as submitted.

On legislation nothing new was reported.

Lindsay Kammeier reported on the status of the ACP and OpenEt for Water reporting. The deadline for SO reporting is extended to April 1, 2023. License Reports are due February 1, 2023.

On Tunnel related Temporary Entry Permits it was reported that DWR was proceeding with additional entries and related litigation is continuing.

As to other agency litigation the litigation against the SWRCB potentially will include the broadest range of important issues.

The Delta Stewardship Council is continuing to proceed with a proposed regulation relating to the Delta Levee Investment Strategy which is inconsistent with the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Delta, ignores the Delta levees as a system and overlooks many of the interrelated flood impacts and risks.

Comments were submitted on the DEIR for the DWR tunnel project called the Delta Conveyance Project (DCP).

On levee programs it was reported that DWR has released a draft Solicitation Package for comment.

On levee conditions during the current atmospheric river event the most significant Delta action was in the Mokelumne-Cosumnes impacted area. The Delta pool elevations did not reach flood stage and damage was controlled except for internal flooding of low lands due to extended loss of power for many of the drainage pumps. A plot of the Venice Island Gage (VNI) readings is attached.

The Delta Protection Commission is working on the Natural Heritage Area and providing comment on the DSC Delta Levee Investment Strategy.

Applications for the DRIP program closed on October 18th and greatly exceeded the number of applications filed last year. The compensation for proposed water savings was substantially lower than for last year.

Thereafter, there being no further business to come before the meeting the meeting was adjourned.
