

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING

April 14, 2026

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the Central Delta Water Agency was convened at 9:30 a.m. at the office of the Agency, 235 East Weber Avenue, Stockton, California.

The first item of business was approval of the Minutes of the March 10, 2026 meeting. After review,

**RESOLVED** that the Minutes of the March 10, 2026 meeting be and they are hereby approved as submitted.

Next, the Financial Report was given, the written portions of which are attached hereto. Along with the Financial Report, the current bills of the Agency were submitted to the Board for their review.

Second - Director Rudy Mussi, the Board unanimously adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED** that the bills of the Agency be and they are hereby approved for payment as submitted, including a contribution of \$50,000.00 to Restore the Delta.

On legislation it was reported that SB 867 which is a bill to fund Delta levees and repairs to the California Aqueduct is a 2 year bill.

Various reports were given on litigation and SWRCB actions. A reminder was that fines would automatically be added to the annual charges for water licenses if reports were not timely filed. The filing of Statements of Diversion and Use under the new SWRCB system was proceeding with some difficulty.

It was announced that Restore The Delta was holding a major event on September 8, 2026 and the Board was asked if they wanted CDWA to be listed as a sponser? The Board,

Thereafter, there being no further business to come before the meeting the meeting was adjourned.

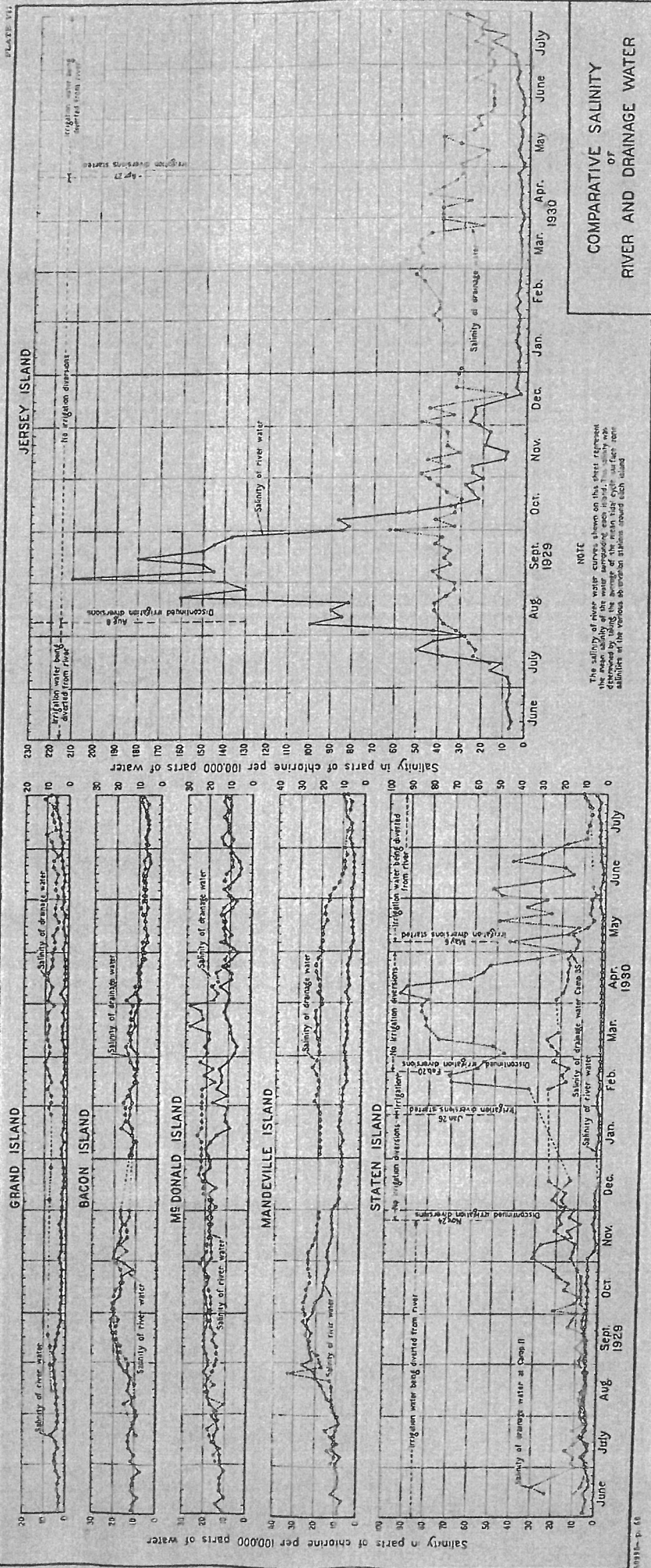

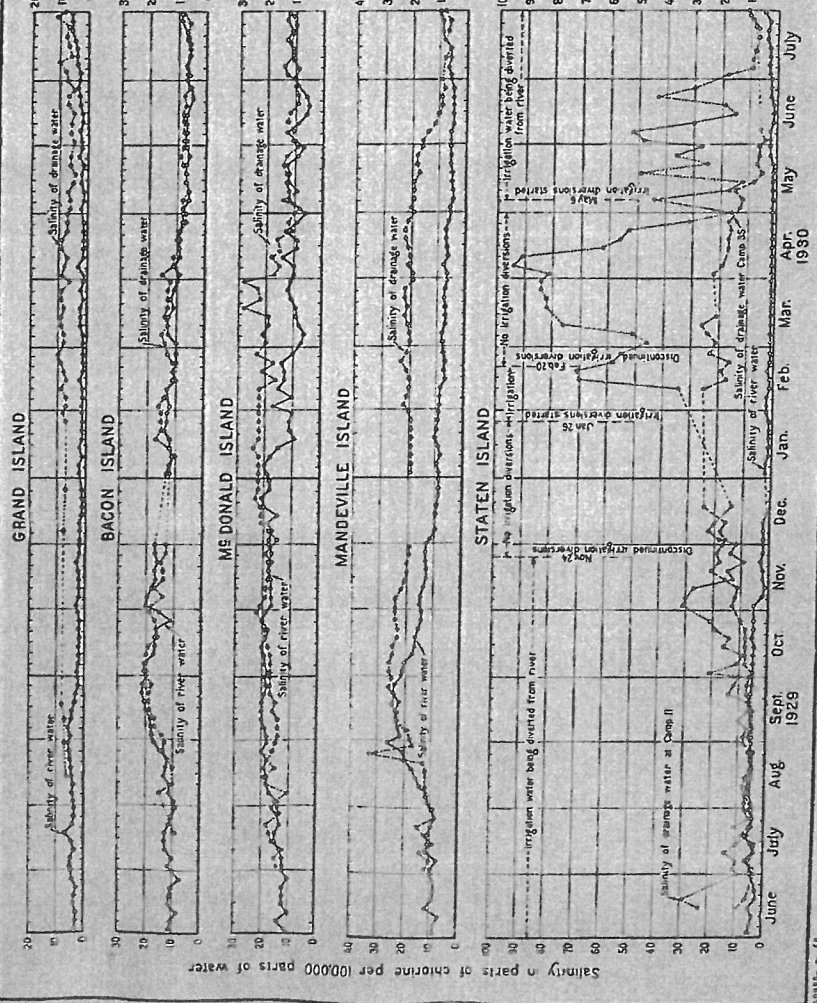
